In November, I shared with you the DAV National Legislative Priorities for 2022-23 on Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C. This month we'll dive into veterans issues facing the 192nd General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, commonly known as Beacon Hill. The best place to obtain current information is on the State website for the Joint Committee on Veterans and Federal Affairs: <u>https://malegislature.gov/Committees/Detail/J31</u>.



Here, you can view the members of the combined House & Senate Joint Committee, as well as search for the status of bills and upcoming hearings concerning veterans. You can also find information on your own local legislators, in order to write, call or visit them regarding veterans legislation.
