

All forms are to be submitted within 10 days of Chapter installation as per Article 8, section 8.7 of the Department By-Laws. If you install at the Department Convention completed forms are to be submitted immediately after installation.

Reminder all properties of the chapter are to be given to the proper officer at your installation. The officers, especially the adjutant and treasurer, are to meet and review all paperwork, so that the AFR (Annual Financial Report) can be completed properly and timely.

Complete and submit the Service Officer Nomination form no later than May 19th, 2023. <u>Service Officer Nominations (dav.org)</u> If a member's name is <u>NOT</u> on the nomination form, they will <u>NOT</u> be allowed to attend training. Please return this form even if your chapter will not have a CSO, or if your CSOs are trained in Providence, RI, state so on the form. We need full accountability from each chapter. All forms should be fully completed online, printed, signed by the incoming commander and adjutant, scanned, and emailed to:
