

It is a high bar that has been set after not only our immediate Past Department Commander (PDC), Bob Kinsman, but all our PDCs. We have many challenges ahead, but

want to also thank all the Chapter officers and members that have given of themselves to make sure that as many Veterans as possible get the help and assistance they need.

By the time you read this, almost sixty of your fellow DAV, DAVA members and guests will be in Phoenix, Arizona for our National Conventions. Thanks to your support, at our Department Convention in June, we passed 26 National Resolutions that have been submitted and will be part of the Legislation agenda for the upcoming year, and for that, I personally want to thank everyone that stepped up to the challenge that I presented last year. Last year there were over five hundred Resolutions that were considered at the National Convention. Fourteen of which became Bills that were brought before Congress. I can't stress enough that the most rewarding way to help the most Veterans and their families is to have a Resolution become a law that was passed by both the US Congress and Senate. Every bill that has ever been passed started with someone saying to themselves, this is wrong and there ought to be a law. It's not too early to start submitting Resolutions to the Department. Just come up with an idea about something that has been bothering you and bring it up at your next Chapter Meeting. Your Line Officers are waiting to help with the formatting of the Resolution, so don't let "I don't know how" become the reason for inaction. Also, remember that the best way for anyone who wants to support Veterans is to become a member of DAVCAN. It's easy and you don't even need to be a Veteran to join. So, while I'm still on my soap box, I might as well remind everyone that if you haven't signed up for MYDAV, please do so at MYDAV.Org. My last pitch for this month is to pay as much attention as possible to signing up DAV Drivers for our Transportation Network. It is the Flagship Volunteer Program for the DAV, and it is what most people think of when you mention the DAV. The Department of Massachusetts currently has 32 vehicles outposted across the state so volunteers can access a DAV vehicle to transport veterans. Volunteers are sent a monthly calendar and select the rides that work within their schedule. If you would like to volunteer to become a DAV Transportation Network Driver, please contact Hospital Service Coordinator (HSC) Phil Nadeau at HSC@davma.org or simply click the 'volunteer now' button on the DAVMA website: https://davma.org/become-a-driver/ to get started, and remember, you don't need to be a Veteran to drive.

There are other areas outside these facilities helping a veteran, with grocery shopping, helping with yard work or just visiting a home bound veteran, or becoming a driver in the transportation program all this activity you can do through the Local Veterans Assistance Program (LVAP).

All times and names should be recorded on the LVAP form and turned into the Department so that they can be organized and turned into National.
